Who is Satan?

I Peter 5:8

⁸ Be of sober *spirit*, be on the alert. Your adversary, the devil, prowls around like a roaring lion, seeking someone to devour.

Hebrews 2:14

14 Therefore, since the children share in flesh and blood, He Himself likewise also partook of the same, that through death He might render powerless him who had the power of death, that is, the devil,

- a. Satan means "an adversary". By implication, the enemy of God (used 51 times in the bible)
- b. He is also called the **Devil**, which means "slanderer" (devil(s) used 109 times in the bible)
- c. Additionally, he is called **Apollyon** which means "destroyer" or "deceiver". This probably best describes his purpose and work. (Revelation 9:11)

Who is Satan?

Let's look at some passages which give us some hints about where he came from and how he came to be the enemy of God.

- a. He was an angel who was puffed up with pride I Timothy 3:6
- ⁶ and not a new convert, so that he will not become conceited and fall into the condemnation incurred by the devil.

Turn to Ezekiel 28:12-19

b. He was cast out of heaven!

II Peter 2:4

⁴ For if God did not spare angels when they sinned, but cast them into hell and committed them to pits of darkness, reserved for judgement;

Jude 6

⁶ And angels who did not keep their own domain, but abandoned their proper abode, He has kept in eternal bonds under darkness for the judgment of the great day,

- **b.** He was cast out of heaven! Revelation 12:7-9
- ⁷ And there was war in heaven, Michael and his angels waging war with the dragon. The dragon and his angels waged war,
- ⁸ and they were not strong enough, and there was no longer a place found for them in heaven.
- ⁹ And the great dragon was thrown down, the serpent of old who is called the devil and Satan, who deceives the whole world; he was thrown down to the earth, and his angels were thrown down with him.

- **c**. Our first exposure to the Satan Genesis 3:1-6
- ¹ Now the serpent was more crafty than any beast of the field which the LORD God had made. And he said to the woman, "Indeed, has God said, 'You shall not eat from any tree of the garden'?"
- ² The woman said to the serpent, "From the fruit of the trees of the garden we may eat;
- ³ but from the fruit of the tree which is in the middle of the garden, God has said, 'You shall not eat from it or touch it, or you will die."

- C. Our first exposure to the Satan Genesis 3:1-6 (cont.)
- ⁴ The serpent said to the woman, "You surely will not die!
- ⁵ For God knows that in the day you eat from it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God, knowing good and evil."
- 6 When the woman saw that the tree was good for food, and that it was a delight to the eyes, and that the tree was desirable to make *one* wise, she took from its fruit and ate; and she gave also to her husband with her, and he ate.

- **d.** Satan remains defiant even to God! Job 1:6-12
- ⁶ Now there was a day when the sons of God came to present themselves before the LORD, and Satan also came among them.
- ⁷ The LORD said to Satan, "From where do you come?" Then Satan answered the LORD and said, "From roaming about on the earth and walking around on it."

- d. Satan is defiant even to God!

 Job 1:6-12 (cont.)
- ⁸ The LORD said to Satan, "Have you considered My servant Job? For there is no one like him on the earth, a blameless and upright man, fearing God and turning away from evil."
- Then Satan answered the LORD, "Does Job fear God for nothing?

- d. Satan is defiant even to God!

 Job 1:6-12 (cont.)
- 10 Have You not made a hedge about him and his house and all that he has, on every side? You have blessed the work of his hands, and his possessions have increased in the land.
- ¹¹ But put forth Your hand now and touch all that he has; he will surely curse You to Your face.".

- 12 Then the LORD said to Satan, "Behold, all that he has is in your power, only do not put forth your hand on him." So Satan departed from the presence of the LORD.

- ⁴ But He answered and said, "It is written, 'MAN SHALL NOT LIVE ON BREAD ALONE, BUT ON EVERY WORD THAT PROCEEDS OUT OF THE MOUTH OF GOD."
- ⁵ Then the devil took Him into the holy city and had Him stand on the pinnacle of the temple,

- C. Satan even tried to tempt Jesus!Matthew 4:1-11 (cont.)
- ⁶ and said to Him, "If You are the Son of God, throw Yourself down; for it is written,
- 'HE WILL COMMAND HIS ANGELS CONCERNING YOU'; and
- 'On *their* HANDS THEY WILL BEAR YOU UP,
 SO THAT YOU WILL NOT STRIKE YOUR FOOT AGAINST A
 STONE."'
- ⁷ Jesus said to him, "On the other hand, it is written, 'You shall not put the Lord your God to the TEST."

- ⁸ Again, the devil took Him to a very high mountain and showed Him all the kingdoms of the world and their glory;
- ⁹ and he said to Him, "All these things I will give You, if You fall down and worship me."

- 10 Then Jesus said to him, "Go, Satan! For it is written, 'You shall worship the Lord your God, and serve Him only."
- ¹¹ Then the devil left Him; and behold, angels came and *began* to minister to Him.

- **g**. Satan has servants in our midst who disguise themselves as followers of Christ:
- II Corinthians 11:13-15
- ¹³ For such men are false apostles, deceitful workers, disguising themselves as apostles of Christ.
- ¹⁴ No wonder, for even Satan disguises himself as an angel of light.
- 15 Therefore it is not surprising if his servants also disguise themselves as servants of righteousness, whose end will be according to their deeds.

Who is Satan?

h. Jesus shared that in some real sense, Satan has been "bound". And he is still "bound!" Consider these passages:

Matthew 12:29

²⁹ Or how can anyone enter the strong man's house and carry off his property, unless he first binds the strong *man*? And then he will plunder his house.

Hebrews 2:14

14 Therefore, since the children share in flesh and blood, He Himself likewise also partook of the same, that through death He might render powerless him who had the power of death, that is, the devil,

h. Jesus shared that in some real sense, Satan was "bound". Satan is still "bound". Consider these passages (cont.):

I Corinthians 10:13

¹³ No temptation has overtaken you but such as is common to man; and God is faithful, who will not allow you to be tempted beyond what you are able, but with the temptation will provide the way of escape also, so that you will be able to endure it.

James 4:7

⁷ Submit therefore to God. Resist the devil and he will flee from you.

h. Jesus shared that in some real sense, Satan was "bound". Satan is still "bound". Consider these passages (cont.):

Revelation 20:1-3

- ¹ Then I saw an angel coming down from heaven, holding the key of the abyss and a great chain in his hand.
- ² And he laid hold of the dragon, the serpent of old, who is the devil and Satan, and bound him for a thousand years;
- ³ and he threw him into the abyss, and shut *it* and sealed *it* over him, so that he would not deceive the nations any longer, until the thousand years were completed; after these things he must be released for a short time.

Who is Satan?

I. The final verdict is God's complete eternal victory over Satan!

Revelation 20:10

10 And the devil who deceived them was thrown into the lake of fire and brimstone, where the beast and the false prophet are also; and they will be tormented day and night forever and ever.

Who is Satan?

Our Conclusions:

- 1. Satan (the devil, Apollyon, and called many other names in the NT) is both God's adversary and ours! (I Peter 5:8)
- 2. As a result of his pride (sin) and defiance of God, Satan and his angels were cast out of heaven after a great battle with Michael and his angels!

 (Revelation 12:7-9)

Who is Satan?

Our Conclusions (cont.):

- 3. He still remains defiant to God and even tried (unsuccessfully) to tempt Jesus in the wilderness! (Matthew 4:1-11)
- 4. Our Lord met Satan in his own domain (death) and triumphed over him! (Hebrews 2:14)
- 5. Satan has servants in our midst who disguise themselves as servants of Christ (II Corinthians 11:13-15)

Who is Satan?

Our Conclusions (cont.):

- 6. Satan is presently "bound", but still possesses the ability to tempt and deceive mankind! However, this can be resisted by the help of God! (I Corinthians 10:13).
- 7. As a result, there are now limitations placed on Satan's ability to harm the righteous. (Matt 12:29) The gospel is the "chain" that now binds Satan (Rev 20:1) and God has promised that He is faithful and will provide a way for us to both escape and endure temptation! (I Corinthians 10:13).

Who is Satan?

Our Conclusions (cont.):

- 8. If we resist the devil, he will flee from us! (James 4:7)
- 9. Satan's final and eternal defeat is assured and he will be "thrown into the lake of fire and brimstone (Hell) forever and ever!" Along with anyone whose name is not found in the book of life!! (Revelation 20:10, 15)
